Subject: New Double Degree for 2007

Dear Student,

If you plan to finish the Bachelor of Applied Science /Bachelor of Information Technology (IF29) at the end of semester 2, 2006, then read no further. The changes we are about to make to the double degree will have no immediate impact on your life.

The Faculty of Information Technology and Faculty of Science have been collaborating to review and revise the double degree program. Starting in Semester 1, 2007 we will roll out a revised version of the double degree. Basically it's about offering more options in building the IT skill sets in the IT component, and overall reducing the number of subjects in the course. Students in the new double degree will have access to nominate a major within the BIT component, ie, instead of being given your major in the BIT component of your double degree you will be able to choose from the full range of majors available. You will also only be required to complete 32 units overall (16 IT units and 16 Science units).

Here's the important bit. The changes to the double degree will NOT affect you if you choose to remain within your existing course code - IF29.

If you are currently in **Second Year (ie started in 2005)** of your course and could be interested in transferring to the new double degree structure, you should contact me (via fit.enquiry@qut.edu.au or Ph 3864 2782) in the next two weeks. We need to discuss your enrolment for Semester 2, 2006 to maximise the transfer of relevant units into the new course in 2007.

The University has approved these changes for 2007. More information on the options for transfer to the new double degrees will be available in August 2006.

So please watch this space.
